There were more than 500 attended delegates and 28 speakers joined the Congress. They came from 35 countries, including Australia, China, Japan, Korea, India, the USA and the UK. The 2nd APOIS Congress will be held in Seoul, South Korea, partnership with Korean Ophthalmological Society (KOS) Annual Meeting, in October 29 – 31, 2021. ## Retinal findings in patients with COVID-19

I would like to share a recent report published in *The Lancet* on retinal and OCT changes in 12 patients with COVID-19 from Brazil. The authors observed hyper-reflective lesions at the level of ganglion cell and inner plexiform layers from OCT in all patients, and subtle cotton wool spots and microhaemorrhages along the retinal arcade in one-third of the patients from color fundus photography and red-free imaging. This report not only give us new knowledge on ophthalmological changes related to COVID-19, but also highlight the importance of ocular imaging for studying systemic conditions affected in the eye.
